Report Title:	Constitution of the NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board				

## Purpose of report

To provide the Board with a final version of the NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board's Constitution.

## **Key points**

The Health and Care Act 2022 abolished clinical commissioning groups, conferring all their functions to integrated care boards as part of integrated care systems with effect from 1 July 2022.

The NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (the ICB) will be the statutory decision-making body for the commissioning of health services from the 1 July 2022 and will be responsible for the effective stewardship of NHS spending for all the people living in the North East and North Cumbria.

The aim of ICBs is to bring health and care organisations together in new ways, with greater emphasis on collaboration and shared responsibility for health of the local population, offering a variety of opportunities for organisations within the NHS and system partners to work more collaboratively in the planning and delivery of services to tackle health inequality and improve quality and outcomes.

The ICB Constitution has been developed over the previous months in consultation with CCG Governing Bodies and has undergone several changes as the NHS Care Bill progressed through Parliament until receiving Royal Assent on 27 March 2022. Changes have also been made as the North East and North Cumbria ICB Operating Model continued to be refined.

The Constitution is fully compliant with NHS England requirements and was formally approved by NHS England on 27 May 2022. A copy is attached at appendix 1 for information.
